Suspension Policy

Glenmore Park Football Club has a policy to handle players and/or teams suspended and fined.

Where a player receives a Red Card during a game, the Tame Manager is required to hand that players card into the Committee Member on duty at Town Centre on the day. If the Card can not be handed in on the day, the Manager is required to phone the GPFC Competition Secretary to arrange to hand the card in.

Any player who receives a red card is automatically suspended for one (1) match. NFA will advise of any further suspension generally before the Friday after the game.

Upon notification of the period of suspension by NFA, the Team Manager will be notified by phone of the details of the suspension and fine. The Coach and Manager will also receive an E-mail confirming details of the suspension. It is up to the Manager and Coach to ensure the player is aware of the suspension and does not take the field during this period for any team.

The player has the right to accept the penalty imposed, or elect to appear before the Judiciary at Unit 9/51 York Road. Penrith. Should the player choose to appear before the Judiciary, the player must contact either GPFC President or Competition Secretary by 7:00pm the following Monday.

The Card will only be returned once the suspension has been carried out and any fine paid in full. The player can not play until the card is returned. Once the suspension is complete and the fine paid, the Id card will be available for pick up from the Committee Member on Duty at Town Centre.

The fine can be paid directly to the Committee member on duty during game days or by arranging payment with the Competition Secretary.

The Player cannot take part in any match until the fine is paid in full.

If the player has not paid the fine by the end of the winter season the suspension occured, the player will be declared un-financial.

Please note: A bye does not count towards any match suspension.

Wash-outs do not count towards match suspension if the match is scheduled to be replayed.

If the opposition team forfeits a game within the time frame of the suspension, the forfeited game shall count as one game. If however, the player's team forfeits a game within the time frame of the suspension, the forfeited game does not count as one game

A player may not be used as an upgrade in another team's game whilst under suspension.

A match suspension means a ban from taking part in a match or to attend the match in the area immediately surrounding the field of play. The host club shall determine the immediate playing area.
